PAYMENT / PAPERWORK

Grave plot payment must be made to MCCGP, before the burial can take place. Details of the current burial fees can be obtained from the MCCGP Office. Grave opening and closing payment be made to Restland Memorial Park.

An email or a letter will be sent by post to the person purchasing the plot, to confirm details held on our records together with details of the exact location of the grave plot on the cemetery map.

Please Note

In purchasing interment rights, you are not purchasing any range of other things, including:

- Endowment care or perpetual care, which is a government-required fund that the cemetery must put money into and use for cemetery care and maintenance costs.
- Opening and closing the grave, which is the actual digging and filling of the grave.
- Installing the headstone or grave marker.
- Annual maintenance fees.

Unused Plots

The cemetery committee which governs the muslim section of the cemetery where the plots are located, controls who receives your unused burial plots upon your death in the absence of a written will or a declaration.

During lifetime, one may leave their unused burial plots to specific beneficiaries in a will as long as the testator has made a specific disposition of the plot by express reference to the plot in the will. Alternatively, one may execute a written declaration with the same specificity, filed and recorded in the cemetery committee's office, naming the beneficiary of the plot upon death.

The plots pass first to your surviving spouse, otherwise to your children on a first-come, first-need basis and then finally to your heirs at law.

Many times burial plots are not specifically mentioned in a will or other document nor are they transferred during the lifetime of the owner. Often, burial plots just keep descending down generation to generation to the heirs of the original owner. This can lead to confusion as to who has the right to be buried in the plots. It can also make the plots difficult to be assigned.

It is worthy to note, if a burial plot in the muslim cemetery is unoccupied and abandoned for failure to maintain or pay assessments for maintenance for 10 years, the ownership or right to be buried **reverts to the muslim cemetery** on a finding of abandonment by the cemetery committee.

Donated Plots or Donations

The plots and funds will be used for burials of children or individuals who cannot afford to pay and in areas of greatest cemetery needs.
